

### Dress Code Rules for In Uniform Days

Standard Uniform	Boys	Girls
Shirts <sup>a</sup>	white or red knit or technical fabric (e.g. DriFit) pullover shirt with collar (with or without Assumption logo only), <i>or</i>	white or red knit or technical fabric (e.g. DriFit) pullover shirt with collar (with or without Assumption logo only), <i>or</i>
	white dress shirt	white uniform blouse, long or short sleeve with round or pointed collar—no lace
Bottoms <sup>b,c</sup>	navy blue twill pants, <i>or</i>	green watch-plaid jumper (K-4) or green watch-plaid skirt (5-8), <i>AND</i>
	navy blue corduroy pants	navy blue, black, or white tights or form-fitting leggings; or athletic shorts must be worn under the uniform at all times. Shorts worn under the jumper may not be longer than the jumper. Leggings must go all the way to the ankle.
Outerwear	navy blue cardigan or sweater, <i>or</i>	
	Assumption logo sweatshirts and pullovers may be worn during the school day.	
Socks <sup>d</sup>	red, white, navy blue, gray or black socks (logos and trim are permitted as long as all parts of the socks are the above colors)	red, white, navy blue, gray or black socks (logos and trim are permitted as long as all parts of the socks are the above colors) <i>or</i>
		navy blue, black, or white tights
Shoes	Athletic type tie-only shoes--low cut, non-marking, and as plain as possible shoe with no flashing lights, <i>or</i>	
	Sperry type shoes are acceptable for school wear but not for PE classes, as long as they tie and are non-marking.	
Belts	navy blue, brown or black belt must be worn if pants/shorts have belt loops in Grades 2-8; belts optional for K and 1st.

Winter shirts (Nov 15 – Mar 14)	White or red long-sleeved polo or turtleneck	White or red long-sleeved polo or turtleneck
Summer shorts <sup>e</sup> (Mar 15- Nov 14)	Navy blue twill shorts; may be purchased at any store.	Navy blue twill walking shorts or skorts; may be purchased at any store.

#### Additional specifications

- a. Shirts must be correctly tucked inside the pants/shorts/skirts.
- b. Pants/shorts/skirts must be worn with the waistline of the clothing at the student's waistline.
- c. Skirts and jumpers must fall within 3 inches of knee length.
- d. Socks must be visible without pulling them up to make them visible.
- e. Shorts should fall within the bottom of the knee and 3 inches above the top of the knee.

- Shirts worn under the uniform shirt or blouse must be plain white--no writing, etc., showing through. Such an undershirt may not extend past the uniform shirt.
- Cosmetics may not be worn for in-uniform or out-of-uniform days.
- Only clear nail polish may be worn for in-uniform days.
- Jewelry, with the exception of small post earrings and watches, may not be worn. Smart watches may not be worn. No jewelry may be worn in a body piercing other than the ears. Body art or tattoos may not be visible.
- Necklaces are not allowed with the exception of religious medals, crosses, and scapulars which should be worn under the blouse or shirt.
- Hair color needs to be a color that occurs naturally as a human hair color.
- No bandanas or scarves tied around the head are permitted.
- No clique or group-identifying apparel of any kind.
- Sweatshirts or sweaters tied around the waist are considered out-of-uniform. This is acceptable only during recess.
- Students may not write messages on one another's clothing. Writing on each other's bodies is also not considered appropriate school behavior.

#### **Dress Code for Out of Uniform Days**

- Modesty should be considered in appropriateness of clothing fit and style.
- No crop tops, shirts with inappropriate sayings or graphics, mesh shirts, spaghetti straps, or tank tops
- Jeans (no words written across the seat of the pants or rips and tears) and modest shorts that cover the body appropriately, athletic shorts, slacks or modest dresses or skirts (no cutoffs or snap-pants) are acceptable.
- Shorts may only be worn from March 15th through November 14th. Shorts must fall between the bottom of the knee and within 3 inches of the top of the knee.
- When students raise their hands in the standing position, no midriff should be bare or showing because of pants or tops that are too short.
- Shoes must always follow the uniform code because of safety. Socks must be worn but may be any color for out-of-uniform days.

#### **Dress Code for Physical Education (grades 4 to 8)**

- Red 50/50 or sports performance T-shirt with Assumption logo from Arch City Screenprinting
- Black gym shorts (boys and girls) or black running shorts (girls only) with Assumption logo from Arch City Screenprinting
- Athletic shoe designed for sports and physical activities with socks.

#### **Dress Expectations for Formal Ceremonies**

Students should wear attire appropriate for church that modestly covers the body. Formal gowns and evening gowns are not appropriate attire for elementary school ceremonies. Shirt and tie with dress slacks are appropriate. Boys may wear a suit or sport coat. Tuxedos are not appropriate attire for elementary school ceremonies. Robes are worn for Confirmation and Completion of Studies church ceremonies.
